LOGAN COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS RESPOND TO STATE COVID-19 DIAL CHANGE

On April 16, 2021, the Colorado COVID-19 Dial evolved into Public Health Order 20-38: Limited COVID-19 Restrictions, which allows counties to implement regulations at the local level while still maintaining some limited requirements across the state. The Logan County Board of County Commissioners are issuing this statement to provide guidance to the citizens and businesses in Logan County.

As of April 16, 2021, there will be no capacity restrictions for indoor or outdoor activities in Logan County. Masking will not be required, *except* as designated in the Governor's Order D2021 079 as follows:

Medical or non-medical cloth face coverings that cover the nose and mouth are required to be worn by individuals age 11 and older when entering or within the following public and private settings:

1. Preschool through grade 12 schools (including extracurricular activities), child care centers and services, and indoor children's camps;
2. Public areas of state government facilities, and areas in state government facilities where members of the public come into contact with state government employees;
3. Congregate care facilities, including nursing facilities, assisted living residences, intermediate care facilities, and group homes;
4. Prisons;
5. Jails;
6. Emergency medical and other healthcare settings (including hospitals, ambulance service centers, urgent care centers, non-ambulatory surgical structures, clinics, doctors' offices, and non-urgent care medical structures);
7. Personal services, as defined by Public Health Order (PHO) 20-36; and
8. Limited healthcare settings, as defined by PHO 20-36.

As always, the Commissioners continue to trust Logan County citizens and businesses to take personal responsibility for themselves and their businesses to best protect their lives and livelihoods. In lieu of further orders from the County or the Northeast Colorado Health Department, the Commissioners will continue to encourage personal responsibility, good hygiene, and the personal choice to be vaccinated. This statement shall not limit the authority of businesses to implement their own COVID-19 restrictions if so desired.
